

FIA Action: The Secretariat will develop a survey to grasp the priority topics and identify personnel in-charge within each member companies.



FIA Action: The Secretariat will conduct a stakeholder mapping of ASEAN countries to understand their positions on the priority topics identified through the survey above.

THE IMPORTANCE OF CODEX STANDARDS





ASIAN COUNTRIES RELY SIGNIFICANTLY ON CODEX STANDARDS

BANGLADESH

The Bangladesh Food Safety Authority (BFSA), in collaboration with FAO, announced 11,200 draft food regulations harmonised with **Codex standards**, slated for gazetting by end-2023. These regulations encompass **vertical** standards covering milk and milk products, meat and meat products, fish and fish products, poultry products, fats and oils, along with **horizontal standards** addressing food additives, processing aids, contaminants, food labelling, food hygiene, inspection and certification, and methods of sampling and analysis.

SINGAPORE

Singapore has been a member of Codex since 1969 and is **actively** involved in various Codex **Committees**, playing a significant role in the development of Codex standards and guidelines. Additionally, Singapore actively adopts Codex standards related to food labelling, food hygiene, and other relevant areas.

Countries that adopt Codex General Standard for Food Additives (GSFA)

Philippines

"Only those food additives adopted by Codex Alimentarius at the proposed level of use for specified food categories shall be included in this Order"

"Where there is no national standard for specific food products, the food additive/s and its maximum level of use shall follow the Codex standard."

Vietnam Issued Circular No 17/2023/TT-BYT, which amends Articles of Circular No.24/2019/TT-BYT of the Minister of Health on Guiding the Management and Use of Food Additives

"Following the CODEX STAN 192-1995, the maximum use levels of food additives and the list of food additives and food subjects used according to GMP will now be automatically updated."



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



FIA will conduct an analysis of the circular letter to ensure that it comprehensively **captures all the discussions and modifications that were addressed during the plenary session**. In the event that the electronic working group is reconvened, FIA will also participate in it.

Plenary Session

Throughout the plenary session, FIA will actively interact with different country delegations to gain insight into their stances on crucial agenda topics. Additionally, we will take the opportunity to advocate for the industry's positions and express our concerns to the respective delegation teams.

PROPOSED WORKPLAN

FIA will circulate our draft comments within two weeks of the release of the consultation paper or circular letter. In cases where **crucial topics are involved**, **a separate call may be arranged** to align on the industry's concerns.

Submission of Comments

FIA will socialise our comments with the national industry associations, aiming to foster a regional consensus. The Secretariat will also closely monitor the comments submitted by the national Codex cells in APAC to gain insights on their positions.



Pre-Plenary Phase

A meeting brief will be crafted one month in advance. This document will encompass FIA's prior comments, along with **potential points or proposals that FIA plans to raise during the plenary sessions.** As an advocacy strategy, we will prepare a **minimum of two alternative proposals.** Furthermore, an alignment call will be scheduled with the pertinent stakeholders to finetune these proposals.



CAC 45: Recognition of the importance of addressing new food sources and production systems (NFPS)

CAC 46 Outcome on NFPS:

Members encouraged to submit discussion papers or new work proposals based on the range of ideas discussed at the meeting.

FIA ACTION

Aug 2023: FIA Secretariat submitted <u>comments</u> on the <u>Circular Letter</u>, addressing the following:

- "Guidance on Approval of New Ingredients and New Technologies" as a specific topic requiring development
- Suggestion to establish an ad hoc intergovernmental task and working group under CAC, to work on identifying approaches to address NFPS topics
- 3. Labelling and adoption of consistent nomenclature as a key point for the scope of NFPS

OPPORTUNITY

FIA Secretariat will engage with SFA's Codex & Novel Food Team, to align priorities and opportunities to collaborate in the workscope of new food sources and production systems (NFPS).


Establishing NRVs-R for persons aged 6 to 36 months **2023:** 2nd Consultation Paper will be sent to members to comment by end of March 2024.


